Development and Peace and Canadian Overseas Federal Funding — Canadian federal funding for DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE'S overseas projects

has dropped in recent years. Fortunately there has been an infusion of federal assistance in our emergency programs (ex. Haiti, Syria, Nepal, Myanmar, Philippines) and also for the empowering of women in civil society organizations overseas. The last federal budget gave an increase but Canada still remains at 0.26% of Gross National Product which is quite minimal given that we are a developed and wealthy country. Denmark, Germany, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden and the United Kingdom have met the international benchmark of 0.7% in official development assistance. Considering inflation, Canada is barely keeping up its current level of assistance which represents about a third of the international standard. DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE has an exceptional 50-year reputation among Canadian non-governmental organizations working in international development. Canada needs to do more! devp.org.



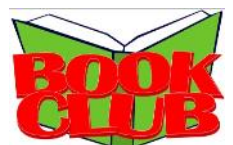
Anointing of the Sick — We will be offering the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the 9:30 AM and 11:30 AM masses on February 17, 2019.
