Doctrine of Discovery and Terra Nullius — Ecumenical Conversation on March 19, 2019 from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM in the Parish Hall — Feast of St. Joseph Patron of Canada — You are invited to an ecumenical conversation on key concepts used to justify European sovereignty over Indigenous lands and peoples. Two years ago, in response to the Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, four major organizations of Indigenous Catholics, bishops, religious, lay justice and peace advocates issued **The Doctrine of Discovery and Terra Nullius: A Catholic Response**. Why would we be concerned with something about which most Canadians and most Catholics have no knowledge? Where are the concepts, which originated in the 15th Century, embedded in our relations with Indigenous nations and with the land itself? Where is God's liberating Action leading us in light of this history? The evening will include a brief film excerpt, an ecumenical panel sharing and a facilitated conversation.

Calvary, before his joyous resurrection. We pray, we fast, we share, and we do works of love. The liturgical colour for Lent is purple. For the children's procession the doves now have purple streamers. It is also a prayerful activity in which the children bless the altar with their presence and share their meaningful ministry with all present at church.

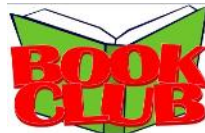

ROC Update — Did you know that the ROC is currently sharing their time, talents and treasures by assisting 14 families (= 38 adults/children), at different levels of their refugee claim, sponsorship, or settlement? In addition to extending friendship to newcomers, ROC volunteers are busy sharing their time and talent:

1. finding lodging, arranging/accompanying newcomers to important appointments (medical, dental, language assessment, school registrations, public transit orientation, rental searches etc.)
2. assisting refugee claimants with the "process" of settlement including connecting families with community services and activities and in some cases guidance in preparing for official refugee hearings
3. through the generous support of our parishioners, our treasure provides our newcomers with: furniture and clothing, short term financial support for living expenses, transportation costs to Refugee Board hearings occurring in Montreal, dental needs, etc.

Our activities are only possible with the generous support of our Parish.
