**Development and Peace Youth Democracy-Building in Syria and Turkey:** Both Syria and Turkey are threatened by chronic conflict and democratic deficits. DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE has decided to focus on youth participation in fundamental freedoms and rights with several partners. Dawlaty, a Lebanese partner since 2012, supports civil society and youth to help with non-violent and democratic transition, justice and citizenship. Pax, which is linked to the Netherlands engages youth in the peace and security process. Meknda Asdalet Dernegi, based in Istanbul, promotes socio-ecological justice. In Syria, the Dawlaty partner is using youth conflict-affected peers' testimonies to support recommendations for youth programming and involvement for the future. In Aleppo, the capital of Syria, several organizations have grouped 500 young people together in activities to dissuade violence and extremism, promote gender equality, avoid hate speech and extremist groups and study the impacts of citizen displacement. The future of these young people needs our support.
