

**Development and Peace/Caritas Canada** congratulates the Quebec government on winning the 2019 UN Global Action Award in the category of Financing Climate Friendly Investment. Quebec's International Climate Cooperation Program, which funds two Develop-

ment and Peace Projects, was created in response to the 2016 Paris Agreement. The \$30m programme funds climate change projects in 11 African and Caribbean francophone countries including the two run by development and peace partners in Haiti and Madagascar. The **Proclima** project in Haiti introduces new agricultural techniques including organic foods, reducing pesticide use, and the raising of poultry and rabbits. The Andohatapenka **Development Council** works with 55 villages in Madagascar providing sustainable agriculture and, reducing flood and unsanitary conditions. Theses **Development and Peace** projects are supported by framework of the 2013-2020 Climate Change Action Plan which is funded by the Green Plan.


