**Development and Peace** **Urging Canadian government to defend the peace process in Colombia.** There is a resurgence of civil conflict in Colombia with a return to arms by the Armed Revolutionary Forces of Colombia (FARC). Fol-

lowing 52-yr war a peace accord was signed which has not resolved the promised land and agrarian reforms. **DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE** supports peasant and indigenous communities. Our 2017 campaign, **MAY PEACE BE WITH HER**, endorses the participation of women in peace-making process. With Colombian partners, **DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE** is urging the Canadian government to condemn the killing, and force the Colombian government to respect the peace process.

**Development and Peace response to Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas.** Category 5 Hurricane Dorian hit the Bahamas Sept. 1st causing serious damage to the islands of Abaco and Grand Bahama affecting 80,000 people. Aid priorities include families of unskilled workers, including Haitian immigrants. Shelter, food and hygiene items, and psychosocial support are much needed. 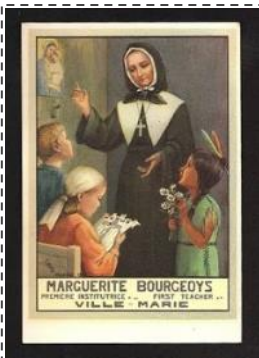
#### **Pastoral Letter Program:**
