## St Joe's History — Tabernacle Society & Display

In the main entrance of the church is one of St. Joseph's Parish's old Tabernacles. It was probably used in the second church from 1892 – 1930. Inside this Tabernacle we found two cardboard sheets listing the names of parishioners, current and deceased, who were members or friends of the Tabernacle Society in Feb 1930. The Tabernacle Society was formed at St. Joseph's in 1928, the cardboard sheets are dated Feb 5, 1930 and the second St. Joseph's church was destroyed by fire Dec 27, 1930.

Why is this list important? Our records of parishioners who were part of our parish in 1930 is limited to those parishioners who were baptized, confirmed, married or died. This list includes names of several sisters of Notre Dame who taught at St. Joseph's school from 1920 to 1929; the Sacristy boys, the ushers, and many Oblate priests, some of whom we did not know served at St. Joe's, as well as the names of other religious, well-known and lesser known families.

These items will be on display for this week only and then transferred to our showcase located in the main entrance to the church.
