GOSPEL: Matthew 22:15-21

This is a reading from the Gospel of Matthew.

Some Jewish leaders, called Pharisees, wanted to trick Jesus into saying something wrong. So they went to him and said,

"Teacher, we know that you are honest and that you always teach the truth about God. We know that you are not afraid of what other people will say about you. You treat everyone the same. So tell us what you think about this—should we pay taxes to Caesar or not?"

Jesus knew they were trying to trick him, so he said,

"You phonies! Why are you trying to trick me? Show me the money you use to pay your taxes."

Jesus looked at it and said,

"Whose picture is on this money, and whose name?"

They answered,

"Caesar's."

So Jesus said,

"Well then, give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and give to God what belongs to God."
