

Step-Up Special Offerings: Monthly Update for December 2023

November 2023: \$880 || Year-to-Date Total: \$17,343

This past fall, our church's front entrance reopened to the community following a long, nine-month construction project. This major capital project cost over \$300,000 and we were able to pay for it by using parish reserves – funds accumulated over the years. In the coming months and years, we will have to ensure that these reserves are replenished, in order to meet upcoming capital needs.

"Step-Up" Special Offerings help to ensure that we have a space in which to worship and gather as a community, and to welcome the marginalized who access our on-site social outreach programmes. Step-Up donations help to pay for essential capital repairs and upgrades to the church and rectory that are not covered by regular Sunday offerings. For this parish community to continue gathering, worshipping and serving in the heart of Ottawa in the years to come, we will have to ensure our heritage building remains in a state of good repair. Thank you to all who donated to Step-Up in December. Each month, we will share an update with you on Step-Up donations received in the previous month. St. Joe's Ministries and Outreach Updates

Development and Peace-Caritas Canada – take action next week-end to support the communities of Guapinol and San Pedro in Honduras!

Development and Peace-Caritas Canada is responding to the call from our partner, ER-IC-Radio Progreso, in Honduras to raise awareness of the tragic plight of the communities of Guapinol and the San Pedro sector. Since 2015, the communities of Guapinol and San Pedro have been fighting to preserve their rivers and the Carlos Escaleras National Park from mining. Many land defenders have been unjustly arrested and eight were detained for over two years. Since being released, three have been killed. We stand with them as they defend their right to water for survival and struggle to obtain:



- Justice
- Reparations and protection
- The cancellation of irregularly granted mining permits
- The restoration of their national park


