

St. Joe's Supper Table

BREAD FOR THE SUPPER TABLE

Bread is essential; it's a staple and it's central to how we see our faith and our relationships with each other. This past week, the St. Joe's Supper Table found itself extremely low on bread, due to a smaller than usual delivery and growing need for our daytime sandwich and coffee service. This year, Roshene Lawson, a parishioner and volunteer, has agreed to help manage the Supper Table's social media presence, including both Facebook and Instagram, and she put out a call for donations of bread. We are so grateful for the response that we received! Within 24 hours of this announcement on social media, we received dozens of loaves of bread donated and cash donations too. It was an interfaith effort, with the Sri Sathya Sai Spiritual Centre of Ottawa Carleton donating 50 loaves on Thursday. Thank you to everyone who helped us continue to address food insecurity among the most vulnerable in the heart of Ottawa!

If you're looking to help the Supper Table with donations of food, we can always use bread, coffee, sugar, whitener and canned meats.

Over the past year, we have seen an increase of 40% in demand to our food banks, as a result, we are increasing our foodbank orders. St. Joe's Ministries and Outreach Updates

Development and Peace-Caritas Canada – sign the letter to the Honduran Ambassador to Canada this weekend to support the communities of Guapinol and San Pedro!

Responding to a call from our Honduran partner, *ERIC–Radio Progreso*, Development and Peace-Caritas Canada is asking Canadians to sign a letter to the Honduran Ambassador to Canada. The letter outlines the experiences of land and water defenders in Guapinol and San Pedro who have been fighting to preserve their rivers and the Carlos Escaleras National Park from the impacts of a large iron ore mine. They have been harassed, subject to intimidation tactics, unjustly imprisoned and three have been murdered.

The letter asks that: those involved in killing the three Guapinol defenders be prosecuted; eight defenders who were detained for over two years be fairly compensated; all Honduran human rights and environment defenders be better protected; all mining in Carlos Escaleras National Park be stopped and the park restored to its premine condition; and all irregularly granted mining permits be canceled.

Development and Peace's goal is 32, 000 signatures on the letter – 1,000 for each of the 32 land defenders arrested – by February 25, the 2nd anniversary of their release. A Development and Peace- Caritas Canada delegation will meet with the ambassador and hand her the letter during the spring of 2024.

Let's stand in solidarity to ask the Honduran government to better protect environmental and human rights defenders and to act for justice. Sign the letter after all masses this week-end. Let's stand for the land, and those who defend it.

2023 Charitable Giving Receipts for Income Tax Purposes

Thank you to all parishioners and friends who donated financially to St. Joseph's Parish and its ministries in 2023! If you contributed through weekly offering envelopes or by auto-debit, you will receive an official receipt for income tax purposes by February 4th, 2024 in the mail. If you donated through Canada Helps, the online platform should issue you receipts automatically in digital format.

A note on emails from Parish staff

Some of our parishioners who use Yahoo and in some cases Rogers email accounts have found that they are not receiving replies or emails sent from Parish email addresses. We are aware of the problem and it's something that extends far beyond St. Joseph's. Major providers like Yahoo and Google (and Rogers, which uses Yahoo email technology) have begun or will soon begin to block emails from addresses that do not implement a new email authentication mechanism. This mechanism is meant to more effectively weed out spam messages. We're working on implementing such a protocol and our volunteer tech support, St. Joe's parishioner Bob Sunday, has been helping us through what is proving to be a convoluted process. Many smaller organizations and private companies with email addresses associated with company domain names, such as st-josephs.ca, are encountering the same problem and many more will experience this in February.
