

Black History Month – MLK in a St. Joe's Bulletin from 1969

St. Joseph's Parish has long had a concern for seeing greater justice in our world, especially for the marginalized. Our parish historian, Terry Byrne, was looking through old bulletins from the 1960s and he found an issue from Advent 1969. In this issue, the Parish published an Advent message from Martin Luther King Jr. As part of Black History Month, we are re-printing this below 55 years later.

The Last Christmas Sermon of Martin Luther King

"I have a dream that one day men will rise up and come to see that they are made to live together as brothers. I still have a dream this morning that one day every Negro in this country, every colored person in the world, will be judged on the basis of the content of his character rather than on the color of his skin, and every man will respect the dignity and worth of human personality. I still have a dream today that one day the idle industries of Appalachia will be revitalized, and the empty stomachs of Mississippi will be filled, and brotherhood will be more that a few words at the end of a prayer, but rather the first order of business on every legislative agenda.

I still have a dream today that one day justice will roll down like water, and righteousness like a mighty stream. I still have a dream today that in all of our statehouses and city halls, men will be elected who will do justly and love mercy and walk humbly with their God.

I still have a dream today that one day war will come to an end, that men will beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks, that nations will no longer rise up against nations, neither will they study war any more.

I still have a dream today that one day the lamb and the lion will lie down together, and every man will sit under his own vine and fig tree, and none shall be afraid. I still have a dream today that every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill will be made low, the rough places will be made smooth, and the crooked places made straight, and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together. I still have a dream that with this faith we will be able to adjourn the councils of despair and bring new light into the dark chambers of pessimism. With this faith we will be able to speed up the day when there will be peace on earth and goodwill toward men. It will be a glorious day, the morning stars will sing together, and the sons of God will shout for joy."
