

Feedback on Sunday morning Mass times

At the start of Advent 2023, we merged our 9:30 am and 11:30 am Sunday morning Masses into a single 10:30 am liturgy. On Gaudete Sunday and in the week that followed, we invited feedback online and in-person from parishioners on their experience of this joint Mass. On January 7, 2024, we shared the results of this survey in the Bulletin. We found that of the 103 households that responded, 75 percent preferred the dynamism of a single Sunday morning Mass. Additionally, 63 percent responded that they would be open to or prefer a 10:00 am Sunday morning Mass, instead of the current 10:30 am timeslot. Many thanks to all those who signed the letter to the Honduran Ambassador to Canada last week-end after mass regarding the situation in the Guapinol and San Pedro sectors of Honduras. We received 131 signatures and this number has been reported to Development and Peace. The actual signed letters will be delivered to the Development and Peace office in Montreal the week after next when Gabielle Dupuis of our parish, who is a member of Development and Peace's National Council, travels there for meetings. Thanks Gabrielle!

Fr. John Dear welcomes Sr. Elizabeth Johnson

On **Saturday, February 15th**, the Beatitudes Center will feature one of their leading theologians, Sr. Elizabeth Johnson, who will join Fr. John Dear in a conversation about her latest book, "Come, Have Breakfast: Meditations on God and the Earth" (Orbis) as well her thoughts on a theology and spirituality of peace and creation, scripture, Jesus and God. What a blessing to welcome this great Christian!

Sr. Elizabeth Johnson is one of the most widely respected theologians of our time. She is distinguished Professor of Theology Emerita at Fordham University in New York City and the former president of the Catholic Theological Society and the American Theological Society, an ecumenical association.

Her latest work, a series of 30 meditations, looks at Earth, its beauty and threatened state, in relation to God. Each meditation offers a snapshot of one aspect of the Holy Mystery who creates, indwells, redeems, vivifies, and sanctifies the whole world. Together, they offer a panoramic view of the living God who loves the Earth, accompanies all its inhabitants in their living, evolving, and dying, and inspires us to care for our common home.


