An Update from the Parish Pastoral Council

Father Robert Laroche, OMI, in collaboration with the Pastoral Council and Financial Council, wrote a letter to Archbishop Damphousse regarding the archdiocesan fundraising efforts for Indigenous reconciliation. The letter asked the archbishop to provide more information about how the funds will be used. It highlighted St. Joseph's commitment to reconciliation, noting the parish's own fundraising efforts following the discovery of potential unmarked graves. The letter also provided feedback regarding the Fall 2023 fundraising efforts and how to improve the efforts for 2024. Throughout the letter, Father Laroche made clear the parish's commitment to reconciliation with Indigenous peoples as well as our efforts as a parish community that have been separate from initiatives led by the Archdiocese. The letter has been sent to the archbishop. We encourage members of the parish community to reflect on further efforts we can take for reconciliation.


