All Souls' Day Memorial Service

Saturday, November 2, 2024 is All Souls' Day. On that day, the Funeral Ministry will be sponsoring a Memorial Service to honour all of our deceased family members and friends. This is the first time since the outbreak of COVID that we have been able to gather as a community to honour our deceased.

Please join us here in the church, on Saturday, November 2, at 10:00 AM. followed by coffee and fellowship. *All are welcome!*

All Souls' Day can be a time to reflect and commemorate those in our lives who have faithfully departed. To assist you in honouring them, we have three options at the Parish: the **All Souls' memorial service** (above), adding your loved ones to the **prayers for those who have died** (back page), or arranging a **Mass Intention** (back page, info below).

A <u>Mass Intention</u> arranges to apply the grace of that Mass toward a specific need, or *intention*. Typically, individuals will arrange an intention for someone they know who is ill, deceased, or to celebrate a special occasion; such as a birthday or anniversary.

We arrange Mass intentions for our weekday noon masses (Wed-Fri) for \$15. It is important to note that the payment is not for the grace of God; but to con-

tribute to the good of the church and support our ministries, works, and social outreach programmes. To arrange a Mass celebration with your intention, please contact Mikayla at the Front Office.

IRF: Help Take Us Over the Finish Line – November 2 & 3

A preamble from our Parish: Due to the generosity of our congregation, our Parish has proudly exceeded the \$10,000 target that we set for ourselves for this campaign. Anyone who would still like to donate to the diocesan campaign is still encouraged to do so during the November 2 & 3 weekend.

During the last two years, your generosity has helped the Archdiocese of Ottawa-Cornwall raise more than \$950,000 for the Indigenous Reconciliation **Fund** (IRF). This money has allowed many worthy projects in our community to receive grants from the IRF. They have included an ongoing Equine Assisted Learning program with Ojibwe Spirit Horses, a confirmation class visiting the tomb of Saint Kateri, the translation of a Catholic hymnal into Mohawk, a Métis art exhibition, Algonquin and Mohawk language revitalization, and more.

Our goal is 1.2 million, and with your support for the upcoming special collection the weekend of November 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} , we will reach our goal this year (2 years ahead of schedule) and allow many more exciting and important projects to be funded. 
