Day for Truth & Reconciliation

Artist Anne-Marie Forest describes the symbolic elements in her painting blending Christian and Indigenous spiritualities. A child is dressed in traditional Innu hunter's clothing, surrounded by references to purity (fleur-de-lis), resurrection (butterfly), and Christ's sacrifice (moccasins with a cross). Symbols such as the cloudberry, fish, salmon, and birch bark basket reflect both Indigenous culture and Christian values, especially the Fruits of the

Spirit, which are paralleled with the **Seven Indigenous Teachings** (wisdom, love, courage, honesty, respect, humility, and truth).

The scene includes Canada geese, a canoe, bear, caribou, and a tent with smoke; referencing both Innu life before colonization and biblical imagery like the **Tent of Meeting**. **Anne-Marie** emphasizes her collaboration with Inuit and Indigenous women on this project, viewing the creation as a prayerful, reciprocal process guided by the Holy Spirit.

Sunday Community Prayer - September 28/25


All wishing to gather with other community members to pray for someone or something important to them, are invited to come together by the west front altar space immediately after Mass.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation events

KAIROS Blanket Exercise: September 29 at 7pm - Parish Hall

The KAIROS Blanket Exercise (KBE) is an interactive learning experience that teaches the Indigenous rights history we're rarely taught. Developed in response to the 1996 Report of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples, which recommended education on Canadian-Indigenous history as one of the key steps to reconciliation, the Blanket Exercise covers over 500 years of history in a one and a half hour participatory workshop.

Blanket Exercise participants take on the roles of Indigenous peoples in Canada. Standing on blankets that represent the land, they walk through pre-contact, treaty-making, colonization and resistance. They are directed by facilitators representing a narrator (or narrators) and the European colonizers. Participants are drawn from the experience by reading scrolls and carrying cards which ultimately determine their outcomes. By engaging on an emotional and intellectual level, the Blanket Exercise effectively educates and increases empathy. The exercise concludes with a debriefing session in the form of a talking circle in which participants have the opportunity to discuss the experience as a group.

This event features an Art Exhibition of local and Indigenous artists from across Ontario. Artists will be selling their art, explaining and demonstrating their craft, and telling stories and significance behind their pieces. In addition, Indigenous educators, dancers, and musicians will deliver teachings and demonstrations throughout the day.
