<u>Development and Peace Coffee – A good deal while doing good</u>



Coffee prices have risen in cafés and grocery stores, but not at St. Joe's. We are still charging the same price that we did when we resumed coffee sales after mass in May 2024 - \$15 a bag, for organic, fair trade, locally roasted coffee.

The wholesale price we pay to our supplier, Equator Coffee Roasters in Almonte, has risen, especially for decaf. This means that the "profit" we make and

donate to Development and Peace is not as much as it was last year. This "profit" is the difference between the wholesale price we pay and the \$15 we charge you.

We are still making a small amount from each bag you buy. Our group's intention is to stay at \$15 for as long as we can. All coffees are available for purchase at the kitchen at the back of the church after Mass every **Sunday** except Hospitality Sunday. Proceeds help support the work and partners of Development and Peace – Caritas Canada in the Global South. Thank you for your faithful support. New buyers always welcome.

St. Joe's Young Adults Host Successful Church Luncheon

Nearly 40 young adults from our parish community prepared and served a tasty, multi-course lunch for parishioners after the morning Mass on Sunday, November 2, 2025. More than 80 parishioners came down to the Parish Hall to enjoy Beef Picadillo or Chickpea Curry, alongside rice, salads and homemade desserts. Our youth provided a top-notch restaurant-style experience, serving each table with a smile! The meal was by donation, making it accessible to all. The young adults raised \$1,700 in support of our church and its young adult ministry.

In addition to raising funds, the purpose of the luncheon was to encourage encounter. Attendance at University Mass regularly reaches 120 and our young adult programmes, including retreats and Scripture study, are at full capacity. This fall, 30 students attended our overnight retreat at Shalom House in Alexandria — which was the retreat centre's maximum capacity. The luncheon was an opportunity for young adults new to our parish to connect with longstanding parishioners. Many thanks to

all who helped make this lunch a success—including many youth working hard in the background cooking meals and washing dishes! Thanks as well to the St. Joe's Supper Table for providing its kitchen and supplies. We're experiencing an exciting time of growth at St. Joseph's Parish!
