Christmas Message from our Pastor

Christmas, the mystery that never ceases to amaze and to move us, is being celebrated tonight around the world. The Virgin Mary gives birth to Jesus, the Son of God, the Word made flesh who comes to live among us. It is through this mysterious event that the shepherds of Bethlehem are filled with joy as they greet the angels who sang: "Glory to God and peace to all".

Festival of Lessons & Carols 2025

Many thanks to our dedicated and talented St. Joseph's Parish Choir and to Jamie Loback, Director of Music and Liturgy, for hosting the annual **Festival of Lessons and Carols** on Sunday, December 21, in support of the St. Joe's Supper Table community meal programme and food bank! The service, elevated by music that is among the best of any church in Ottawa, raised \$4,000 in support of the Supper Table. More than 160 parishioners and members of the broader Ottawa community joined our 30 choristers, and stayed for a reception and time of fellowship following the service.

The carols sung encapsulated the essence of Christmas: the light and the hope of universal redemption in the incarnate God — Jesus, the King of Kings, who is born on the most distant peripheries of a great empire, on the margins of society. Perhaps none encapsulated that hope of God with us more explicitly than the verse: "As with gladness men of old, Did the guiding star behold, As with joy they hailed its light, Leading onward, beaming bright. So most gracious God, may we Evermore be led to thee."

Christmas: Did you know...

Xmas is a common abbreviation for Christmas; where some incorrectly perceive as "crossing Christ our of Christmas". In reality, the 'X' comes from the Greek letter Chi (X) – the first letter of Christ's name (Χριστός) in Greek, making it a traditional shorthand meaning "Christ's Mass". The suffix "-mas" comes from the Old English mæsse, meaning Mass or festival, so Xmas itself is derived from Greek and Old English to mean "Christ's Mass".



Secular holiday celebraters still enjoy Christmas; often with **candy canes**, children having a visit from **Santa Claus**, and putting up a **Christmas tree**. However, these celebrations are not as far removed from religion as most think! *Learn more about the symbols of each below*.



The big bearded, rosy-cheeked jolly old gift-giving man is known as Father Christmas; but have you wondered how he got the name Santa Claus? It's from *Sinterklaas*, which means Saint Nicholas in Dutch. St. Nicholas was a Christian bishop who lived in the 4th century – known for being kind and generous. He later became the patron saint of children.

Candy Canes emerged from Germany in the 1600's, where sugar sticks were bent into the shape of a shepherd's crook – allegedly to keep children quiet and occupied during nativity services. The shape symbolises Jesus as the Good Shepherd; and the colours white as purity, and red for Christ's blood.

The simple Christmas Tree represents hope and life through the winter, and decorated with lights (formerly candles) sumbolising Christ as the "light of the world".
