
Receipts from this past year will be distributed at the back of the church before and after all Masses this weekend.

Rolly was a key member of the St. Joe's History Committee, often researching information about our parish and its people at the National Archives, Oblate Archives and War Museum. One of his lasting legacies for our parish will be the stories he wrote about those parishioners who died in the two world

wars. These stories can be found below the plaques in the front entrance of the church that honour all the parishioners who served in these wars.


St. Joe's Dialogue Circle on Renewed Relations

The Dialogue Circle On Renewed Relations Committee has invited KAIROS Canada to facilitate the Blanket Exercise. It is a powerful tool to help us learn the History of Indigenous People in Canada.

The exercise uses blankets to represent the lands of what is now called Canada, and the distinct cultures and nations that live on those lands to this day. Participants represent the First Peoples; when they move onto the blankets, they are taken back in time to the arrival of the Europeans. A narrator and a person playing the role of a European work with the participants to read a script while the exercise goes through the history of treaty-making, colonization and resistance that resulted in the nation we today call Canada. The Blanket Exercise itself takes about 30 to 40 minutes, and is always followed by a Talking Circle.
