—Thank you to Maryann and her crew from the University of Ottawa for making the Supper Table a part of their food recovery program.


Mugs Please!—We are continually in need of coffee mugs to use during our dinner service..

WRITE FOR RIGHTS AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL

ROC & Amnesty International Write for Rights Event at

St. Joe's—December 10 is International Human Rights Day. To mark this day, thousands of people across Canada and around the world take part in Amnesty International's Global Write for Rights event. Amnesty International provides background information on persons or groups whose rights are being denied,

and gives direction for actions that can be taken through letter writing. Letter writing has been instrumental in providing protection to vulnerable individuals and groups and in gaining freedom for many who are unjustly imprisoned. Those who received such cards relate how supported they felt knowing that they were not forgotten.

Royhingya Refugee Crisis in Myanmar and Bangladesh

Myanmar military have pushed nearly one million people from the Rakhine State into neighboring Bangladesh. Many in Myanmar have had their homes burned and have had to flee on foot. Development & Peace and Caritas Canada have offered food to 25,000 of these refugees. The Royhingya are a musulman minority in Myanmar, which is mainly Buddhist. The United Nations have identified the situation as
