Rectory Roof Replacement Project ***Update Donations received as of August 12:*** **\$14,250**

On August 13th, work on the complete replacement of the rectory roof began. As we indicated earlier, the rectory roof has reached the end of its lifespan and leaks have become a growing problem. Workers with Capital Contractors Ltd. are on site for a period of 10 days and have fenced off the staff spots in the parking lot, from where they access the roof and keep equipment. The roofers work six days a week (Monday through Saturday) and are committed to completing the project within 10 days, weather permitting. With the

exception of a rainy day, the project has thus far gone according to plan with only minor disruption to the Parish.



Thank you to all who have donated thus far to this essential capital project. Our overall expenses stand at \$68,000 and we will continue raise funds and keep our community upated. You will find envelopes marked for this purpose in the pews, with each envelope also including slips for those who wish to make a donation using their credit card.
