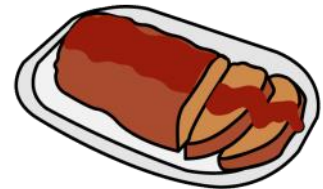
Hi everyone!

## FIRST COMMUNION 2019 REGISTRATION — PLEASE TAKE

**NOTE:** First Communion classes will begin on February 17 so as not to interfere with the Ministry Information Fair. Children in Second grade are eligible to be registered for First Communion preparation. Registration can be completed online on the St. Joseph's Website under "Sacraments" and "First Communion Preparation" (the link is at the bottom of the page). A copy of the child's baptismal certificate is needed. Classes will be held Sunday mornings. Students, parents, and catechists will be dismissed from the 9:30 Mass after Communion and classes will end around 11:20. Parents will meet in the Main Floor Meeting room for their sessions and the children will meet in the upstairs Oblate Lounge for their sessions. Classes will be held: February 17, 24; March 3, 24, 31; April 7. First Communion Mass will be held on Sunday, April 28, 2019 at the 9:30 a.m. Mass. Suggested donation is \$30 or whatever you can give (do not let the suggested donation be a hindrance to you registering your child.)
