tions from 56 countries have identified this inaction in establishing social and environmental justice and fair pricing and treatment for overseas communities with natural resources. Over 50% of world mining is Canadian-backed. Truthful and independent investigation of cases and testimony from the South would break the injustices and profiteering by 1500 Canadian mining companies investing in more than 100 Southern countries (ex. Peru, Haiti, Tanzania, Papua New Guinea, Honduras, Colombia). DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE has had a focus during three yearly campaigns on the mining question and obtained a Canadian record of 500,000 post card signatures addressed to the federal government. Much more public transparency is needed in this sector which generates immense wealth and creates havoc for many of our Southern partners. 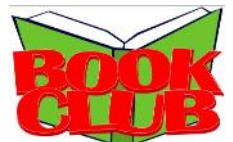
