The 2019 Christmas season is fast approaching and many families are patiently awaiting this joyous time of year. Yet, for those who come ST. JOE'S to St. Joe's Women's Centre, Christmas is often a time of worry and tight budgets. The mothers who come to the Centre would love nothing more than to provide a warm and nutritious meal and a little something under the tree for their family but often struggle to make this a reality. This is why we are reaching out to you and generous supporters like yourself.

Have Your Say, Respond to Flourishing Congregations Survey

Thus far, 46 St. Joe's parishioners completed the Flourishing Congregations survey. Thank you for providing your feedback on our parish's ministries and your priorities as a parishioner. This is a national academic survey spearheaded by Ambrose U and the U of Saskatchewan, with the support of the Archdiocese of Ottawa. The survey explores vitality or decline of parishes, by providing comprehensive data on the state of Christian denominations in Canada. St. Joseph's Parish will receive conclusions specific to our community which will be shared with you.

The Archdiocese asks that at least 25% of parishioners in each parish complete the survey, approximately 135 parishioner responses at St Joe's. Presently, our rate of response is approximately 9%.
