GOSPEL: Matthew 16:13-19

This is a reading from the Gospel of Matthew.

When Jesus and his disciples were in the area of Caesarea Philippi, he asked the disciples,

"Who do people think I am?"

They said,

"Some people say you are John the Baptist, and others think you are the prophet Elijah. But there are others who say you are Jeremiah or some other prophet."

Jesus asked them,

"And who do you say I am?"

Simon Peter answered,

"You are the Christ. You are the Son of the living God."

Jesus said,

"Simon, you are blessed.
You did not learn that from any human being.
No, God told you that. And I tell you,
you will be called Peter, which means "rock."
