Pastoral Integration for Newcomers

As we entered the season of Advent and are preparing for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Church invites us to reflect on the ways to welcome the Divine Child, to be prepared, and to wait with hope despite all the darkness that may be around us! Being a member of a community is a necessary factor in the growth of the individual in faith and it constitutes a crucial element in the support system of the faithful in tackling the spiritual challenges and those of everyday. The continuity of a community is guaranteed by new members -- not just to grow in numbers but to bring new talents, ideas and shape its character. In many cases, newcomers find themselves in need for support for better pastoral integration and seek in diverse parishes a place to start a new life. It is a place to contribute through what they are gifted for to the growth of their Christian life and that of the community.

Integrating into a community and investing someone's talents in it is not always easy and smooth. Many newcomers land in the closest parish or church regardless of how it responds to their aspirations or spirituality. Furthermore, sometimes a lack of information regarding the existing ministries and groups in it may confuse their integration process and may take more time before they find – or not - the way to invest their talents in the correspondent church service.

What seems obvious for regular and longstanding parish members may seem totally exotic and strange to a newcomer. Therefore, we ask ourselves could our parishes, and in the case of Saint Joseph's Church, where 'All are welcome!' put in place strategies for the sake of newcomers and their integration into Church life and define ways to enrich our pastoral experience by the talents of all its members? Would a **Newcomers Pastoral Orientation Ministry**, for instance, be a seemly response? We welcome your input, speak to any member of PPC.
